

In antiquity, the human heart was regarded as "the center of volition." This meant that (long before the advent of medical science) the heart was conceived of as the part of a person which supplied that individual with courage. Consequently, giving someone the command "Take heart" was the equivalent of saying "Be of good courage."

There are a variety of incidents depicted in the Gospels during which Jesus declares, "Take heart!" Each time Jesus says this, he is summoning people to display courage. One example of such an interaction was recounted in the Gospel reading during worship at Ivy Chapel United Church of Christ on a recent Sunday. Jesus concludes his farewell speech to the disciples, declaring in John 16:33, "I have told you these things, so that in me you may have peace. In this world, you will have trouble. But take heart! I have overcome the world." (Today's New International Version, 2005) The Common English Bible (2010) translates this passage: "I've said these things to you so that you will have peace in me. In the world, you have distress. But be **encouraged**! I have overcome the world."

Every human being is a child of God who needs encouragement. In her book <u>The Art of Encouragement</u> (2002), Candy Paull cites an Irish proverb, "God likes help when helping people." Paull also writes, "Encouragement is... inspiring each other to embrace life with enthusiasm, courage, and love." There is a lovely, mutual quality to offering encouragement. In the greeting of his letter to the Church in Rome, the Apostle Paul writes, "To all God's beloved in Rome, who are called to be saints: Grace to you, and peace from God and the Lord Jesus Christ. First, I thank my God through Jesus Christ for all of you, because your faith is proclaimed throughout the world... For I am longing to see you so that I may share with you some spiritual gift to strengthen you - or rather so that we may be mutually encouraged by each other's faith, both yours and mine." (Romans 1:7-8, 11-12)

Long ago, in the days the Early Christian Church was gaining a foothold, there was a new convert, a Levite from Cyprus, whom the disciples gave the baptismal name Barnabas,

meaning "son of encouragement." (Acts of the Apostles 4:36) He was given this name because leaders of 'The Way' perceived the Spirit of God dynamically alive in him. Barnabas became an exceptional, vivacious disciple who boldly witnessed to the eternal love of Christ! The verb "to encourage" is defined by Merriam-Webster as "to give support, confidence, or hope to (someone)." Isn't this what Jesus of Nazareth faithfully and consistently does? Each time Jesus proclaims, "Take heart!" what Jesus is doing is offering encouragement to those he is addressing. Through his words and his actions, Jesus is eternally calling all people to encourage one another.

Candy Paull closes her book <u>The Art of Encouragement</u> with the Benediction which is inscribed at the Glouchester Cathedral in England. The inscription is based on a lovely Benediction from the Book of Common Prayer (1892, 1928, modified):

Go forth into the world in peace.
Be of good courage.
Hold fast to that which is good.
Render to no one evil for evil.
Strengthen the fainthearted.
Support the weak.
Help the afflicted.
Honor all people.
Love and serve the Lord,
rejoicing in the power of the Holy Spirit;
and the blessing of almighty God,
the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit,
be among you and remain with you always.
Amen.

Everyone needs **encouragement.** The Glouchester Benediction summons each and every human being, "Go into the world in peace. Be of good courage. Strengthen. Support. Help. Honor. Show love to everyone." As taught by our Savior Jesus Christ, may we joyfully offer **encouragement.**

A group of 5 people visited the Republic Recycling Center on May 21st. We learned that most of the recycling is automated using spinning rubber discs in various widths and angles to separate paper, infrared lights to identify brown and white paper and the various plastics with air jets to separate them, and strong magnets to pull out metals. Things that might interfere with this process are pulled out by people at the beginning of the cycle. About 80% of what they receive is recycled by them with some items going to other processors and some going to landfills.

It is indeed a dusty, noisy environment.
