

God is our Savior. God gives salvation.

Every once in a while, you and I are blessed to behold someone remark, "What a gift of God!" These moments of spontaneous gratitude can seem quite few and far between. Nevertheless, moments do arise when such an exclamation is voiced. When this happens, it can give us chills.

Our faith is strong on acknowledging God's gifts. In practice, though, our day-to-day lives may not be.

Here's a brief prayer of William O'Malley, which is found in his spiritual guidebook <u>More Daily Prayers for Busy People</u>:

God, my friend, help me see the difference between "seems" and "is." Amen.

Together, let's pause. Take a deep breath. Attempt to summarize our faith in basic terms. The Gospel of Jesus Christ is the life story of Jesus of Nazareth. Jesus is the Son of God. The Gospel is God's message of joy! Frequently, it is referred to as "the Good News." The Gospel is the extravagant message that, as Jesus Christ, God *gives* every human being eternal gifts of love and salvation! No one deserves or earns these gifts. They are simply *given* by God to all people. Regrettably, it is evident that many people, including a large contingent of "self-proclaimed Christians," lack clear perspective on this truth: God *gives* gifts.

I feel that when people try to pressure other people with questions, such as, "Are you saved?" or "Have you accepted Jesus Christ as your personal Lord and Savior?"; this often reveals the questioner's failure to appreciate the genuine character of salvation through Christ as a pure *gift of God*.

In the Second Letter to the Church in Corinth, the Apostle Paul writes about "a thorn... in the flesh" which is tormenting him: "Three times I appealed to God about this - that it would leave me; but God said to me, 'My grace is sufficient for you, for power is made perfect in weakness.'... Therefore, I am content with weaknesses, insults, hardships, persecutions, and calamities for the sake of Christ; for whenever I am weak, then I am strong." (2 Corinthians 12:8-10) The grace of God always is enough. Trust this promise, my friends. God's grace is sufficient for you.

God *gives* everyone grace and salvation simply because God desires to *give*. In his Letter to the Romans, the Apostle Paul repeatedly emphasizes salvation through Christ is "the *free gift* of God." (Romans 5 and 6)

As Jesus commissions the Twelve Disciples and sends them out to do ministry, a significant part of what Jesus commands is, "Freely you have received; freely give." (Matthew 10:8)

All shall be Amen and Alleluia.
We shall rest and we shall see.
We shall see and we shall know.
We shall know and we shall love.
We shall love and we shall praise.
Behold our end which is no end.
Saint Augustine of Hippo (354-430)

This wonderful *Amen and Alleluia* prayer of Saint Augustine is cited by Archbishop Desmond Tutu in the 'Adoration' portion of his 1995 <u>An African Prayer Book</u>. In life, in death, in life beyond death; God loves all humankind! Eternal life, eternal salvation through Christ is a *gift of God*.

All people are blessed, for salvation is given to all as the free gift of God.

May you and I live with deep gratitude to God for this wondrous gift! Pastor Dan


