

A treasured hymn that the church congregation I once served in Kansas loved to sing as an opening worship hymn was "Blessed Quietness" by Manie Payne Ferguson. Manie Payne was born in southeast Ireland in 1850 roughly 84 kilometers from Dublin in the town of Carlow. As a young woman, Manie came to the United States of America. In 1883, she and Theodore Pollack Ferguson were married in Ohio. In 1879, the married couple relocated to California. In November 1886, they founded the Los Angeles Mission, which was eventually renamed "Peniel Mission." This name was based on the overnight wrestling match that Jacob had with God in the Book of Genesis. When it was over, Jacob "prevailed." But, in the struggle, Jacob's hip had been put out of joint, and so he was left walking with a limp. God blessed Jacob there on that piece of land. "So Jacob called the place Peniel." (Genesis 32:30) The name "Peniel" is a Hebrew word which means "face of God."

Manie Payne Ferguson was a creative writer who composed many poems and hymns. The hymn she is best known for is "Blessed Quietness." This hymn's reassuring lyrics include: "Joys are flowing like a river, Since the Comforter has come; He abides with us forever, makes the trusting heart His home... Like the rain that falls from Heaven, Like the sunlight from the sky, So the Holy Ghost is given, Coming on us from on high. Blessed quietness, holy quietness, What assurance in my soul! On the stormy sea, He speaks peace to me. How the billows cease to roll!"

As autumn arrives in the Northern Hemisphere this year, one does not anticipate that there will be "quietness" - especially not in our nation as a highly contested national election is approaching. Yet, whether coming days will be characterized by tranquility or by storms, the eternal calm promised by God will be able to surface. Christ speaks peace. Retaining an enduring faith in this promise will require strength of soul. Let humankind not forget who God is. God is the Creator and the Provider. God does provide strength of soul to God's people. In your personal Peniel, watch for the "face of God." Rely on God.

Let us receive and be grateful for the tranquility of the biblical psalms. Even during the most tumultuous of times, draw comfort and spiritual strength from William O'Malley's translation of God's Word: "I thrashed in quicksand, and my Creator bent down to me, pulled me from the mire, and set my feet on rock. My panicked heart subsides, and I can breathe! Steady my steps, O God. I am wobbly as a child, reborn from the womb of pain, learning again, this time in a world far bleaker than before. Tumbling into mire, the rescue, the bleak new world - I make no pretense to understand, except that in the scroll of the Book I'm told to obey. You are the God who called me forth from nothingness. Thus, every day is a gift I don't deserve. I did nothing to merit these days of pain - and yet, neither did I merit the days of joy and peace, the heedless laughter, the rejoicing, those I love. Help me not to forget just who you are. And who I am."

### Trustees

Keeping Ivy Chapel cool is one of the big jobs for the Trustees and we maintain 5 AC units. As recently as May 2022, a new AC unit had to be installed to help cool the sanctuary. Now one of the AC units for Fellowship Hall has failed and the estimated replacement cost is \$10,000. Besides providing space for the congregation to gather after the service and for special luncheons, renting out the Hall to outside groups generates important income for Ivy Chapel. An appeal for funds to replace this AC unit, *Fund the Facility*, has gone out to Church members.

As part of the annual maintenance of the HVAC systems, the zone controller on the lower and west furnaces was repaired. A new transformer will be installed to relight the outside Cross. On the grounds, mowing continues and the gutters and the playground have been cleaned up for the start of school. Trash pick-up of Woods Mill Road was accomplished on August 18. The final pick up of the year is scheduled for Sunday, November 3, weather permitting.

### Mary Martha Wmns Grp

The Mary and Martha Women's Group met on Aug. 20<sup>th</sup>, 2024 with a devotion from Dottie Foster. It was decided that the money from Dessert for a Dollar on Aug. 25<sup>th</sup> will be given to Unleashing Potential (formerly Neighborhood Houses) which promotes families and education for children. Since we have the funds, it was also decided to give \$100.00 to Fund the Facility to help purchase a new air conditioner at Ivy Chapel. We shared information about our May trip to the Republic Recycling Center with those who were unable to make the trip.

On September 17<sup>th</sup> we will have lunch at Spiro's Restaurant to enjoy time together. We will meet at Ivy Chapel at 1 p.m. and carpool to the restaurant which is close to the church.


