

The month of November is a time of beauty and transition. Here in the Northern Hemisphere we are shifting toward winter as tree leaves fall and daylight hours dwindle. November is a pivotal portion of the autumn season when plants die, and when God's creation goes through big changes. This is also the month when we celebrate a national Day of Thanksgiving!

The Apostle Paul writes, "Let your gentleness be known to everyone. God is near. Do not worry about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all human understanding, will keep your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus." (Philippians 4:5-7) As people of God, we give God thanks and praise for all of our blessings!

The theme of our UCC Missouri Mid-South Conference Annual Gathering (MMS CAG) on October 18 and 19 was **"LOVE Is Greater Than Fear."** This was a very timely, apropos theme. (Ecclesiastes 3:1-8) In this country, the month of November this year will include a highly contentious national election. Many concerns and fears are currently being experienced in connection with the impending November 5th election. It sounds great to say, "Do not worry about anything." But it's not so easy, is it? In this regard, MMS CAG was reassuring and comforting. No, the gathering did not allay all of our worries and fears. However, our time together as a Christian community did provide strength of soul.

One of our worship songs on Saturday, October 19 was "Love Is Greater Than Fear" composed by Rev. Monty Jackson, Pastor of Kindred United Church of Christ in Maplewood. Lyrics to this stirring song include, *"There is no fear in Love. Love is enough, more than enough. Whether fight or flight or faint, you won't go under. You will recover. Love dispels all fears. Dries away all tears. Love, O Love, is greater than fear. When we face our fears, it all becomes so clear. Love, O Love, is greater than fear." (Rev. Monty Jackson)*

The foundation for Monty's song is the First Letter of John 4:16-19: "God is love, and those who remain in love remain in God, and God remains in them. Love has been perfected among us..., because as God is, so are we in this world. **There is no fear in love**, but perfect love casts out all fear... We love, because God first loved us." This Scripture also served as the basis of

Rev. Michael Neuroth's sermon during that day's closing worship. As it was unfolding, that recent conference experience brought to mind the 2016 book <u>Fear of the Other</u> written by Rev. Will Willimon, Duke University Divinity School. Willimon's book also is based on 1 John 4.

Not long ago, I came across a wonderful children's picture book, written by Cynthia Rylant and illustrated by Jill Kastner. Here is a portion of the story, "In November, the earth is growing quiet. It is making its bed, a winter bed for flowers and small creatures. The bed is white and silent, and much life can hide beneath its blankets. In November, the trees are standing all sticks and bones. Without their leaves, how lovely they are, spreading their arms like dancers. They know it is time to be still... In November, animals sleep more. The air is chilly and they shiver... In November the smell of food is different. It is an orange smell. A squash and pumpkin smell. It tastes like cinnamon and can fill up a house in the morning, can pull everyone from bed in a fog. Food is better in November than any other time of year. In November, people are good to each other. They carry pies to each other's homes and talk by crackling woodstoves, sipping mellow cider. They travel very far on a special November day just to share a meal with one another and to give thanks for their many blessings - for the food on their table and the babies in their arms... In November, at winter's gate, the stars are brittle. The Sun is a sometime friend. And the world has tucked her children in, with a kiss on their heads, till spring." (Cynthia Rylant, In November, Harcourt, Inc., 2008) Be still, and know that the God of November is our refuge. I love this kids' book, and I love autumn!

One of the distinctive elements of décor which goes along with Thanksgiving Day is the cornucopia. The imagery of a cornucopia - a "horn of plenty" - is an amazing imagery! The traditional Thanksgiving cornucopia is overflowing with plentiful fruit of the harvest! Indeed, Christ Jesus proclaims, "I have come, so that all may have life, and life abundant." (John 10:10) God's gifts and blessings truly are abundant!

In November and always, may our love for God and for one another overflow! Our Risen Savior Jesus is summoning us to lead lives of thanksgiving. As we move through autumn, and as we move through this November, and as we move into the future; may we faithfully rely on God for guidance. Christ Jesus takes grace and giving to a whole new level. (Matthew 5:38-48) Fearlessly follow Christ, and your life will be a source of thanksgiving for all of your neighbors.
