

You are a blessing to me, Ivy Chapel United Church of Christ!

It is a privilege for me to enjoy this Ivy Vine platform of expression, and I genuinely treasure this. As you may imagine, there have been many previous occasions when

I have struggled to put into words the message that I would seek to offer you through the Pastor's Reflection in our monthly newsletter. Now, as I consider what thoughts God is leading me to express in this final Pastor's Reflection, once again, I am struggling. Yet the struggle is worthwhile, for this effort is a labor of love. Here goes!

You will recall that the tune *"Gloria!"* (Umberto Tozzi, 1979) was sung with vigor by St. Louis Blues hockey fans at the conclusion of home game victories down the stretch of the of the 2018-2019 National Hockey League season and playoffs. That was the season when the St. Louis Blues won the Stanley Cup Trophy! The victory song *"Gloria!"* became an instant tradition among fans that year.

There was another time in history, 300 plus years earlier, when renowned composer Johann Sebastian Bach (1685-1750) cultivated a personal habit which was intended to give **God** glory. Bach completed his church compositions by signing them with the letters **SDG** in addition to his personal signature. These three letters are Bach's shorthand for a Latin phrase: **"Soli Deo gloria,"** meaning, *"Glory to God alone."* Bach placed these three letters at the end of his compositions to make the utmost purpose of his work clear - his music was not to bring glory to the performers or to the conductor (or even to Bach himself, as the composer). Ultimately, the music was crafted for the *glory of God.* For Bach, every note, chord, and page of music points beyond itself, beyond its human creator, to *the* Supreme Creator, who is *God*.

S *D G* captures the essence of Paul's words: "So whether you eat or drink, or whatever you do, do it all for the *glory of God*." (1 Corinthians 10:31) For Bach, **S** *D G* was a method of acknowledging that all of life is an expression of God's glory. Everything can serve to offer God praise and glory.

My personal assertion is that this view surely pertains to my life serving in parish ministry. *Soli Deo gloria!*

Regarding my pastorate serving Ivy Chapel United Church of Christ, in particular, there is so much to say. There is far more than can be expressed in human words. The emotions and the memories which I am feeling these days are beyond words, dear friends. It is said that sometimes less is more. In this regard, may I simply say, "Thank you."

We go back a ways! In the year 1998, God called me to serve this congregation as pastor and teacher. This I have attempted to do. However, I have not served you flawlessly. I have made mistakes along the way. From my heart, I sincerely thank you for the forgiveness and the grace which you have offered me. You have taught me much, and you have led me to grow as a follower of Christ. I thank you for this tremendous blessing!

I celebrate the countless joys which you and I have been blessed to experience while serving God alongside each other over this bountiful stretch of time! My hope is that you and I have taught one another and we have learned from one another. **Soli Deo gloria!** Community of Christ, I give God thanks for you; for my time among you; and for the abundant, giving ministries in which we have participated together. Forever will I be your grateful companion in Christian faith.

Ivy Chapel United Church of Christ, you are a community of God's grace. May you go forward assured of God's presence within you and beyond you. As I conclude this final reflection, I would like to offer you a simple yet enduring message which I pray you will carry with you in your soul forever: **God loves you.**
